


### AMITY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH 2022 ANNUAL REPORT

And even with the goodness in 2022, we were no strangers to sorrow. As a church family, we said goodbye to many loved ones, saw each other through illness, grief, and struggle, and too often felt the heartbreak of national tragedy. These are the moments we truly learn what it means to be the church and to be Christ's love with and for one another.


### Loving: Worship & Care

Worship is what makes us a church. We believe we are called together to give our hearts to God in worship and to care for each other as only the church can. Money in this area pays our **pastor and musicians** for their gifts and preparation time, for a **sanctuary** where we can gather to worship, and for **supplies and resources** that help make our worship clear and meaningful, as well for home and hospital **visitation and congregational care** efforts.

### Serving: Outreach & Missional Connection

Scripture calls us to love our neighbors as ourselves, to alleviate suffering and stand for justice. Money in this area supports our presbytery and local missional giving by directly meeting emergency needs for our neighbors and church members such as food, housing, and help with utilities. It pays the pastor and staff for their efforts in responding to those needs and connecting with the community. The bulk of this portion of our budget goes into the care, maintenance, and use of our church building and grounds to allow us to host the 8+ ministry partner organizations that call Amity home.

By keeping the lights on and the doors open, we get to be a **safe and joyous place** where kids learn music and martial arts, people find a sacred place to pray, addicts find strength in community, hungry bellies are filled, and people meet Jesus. While the budget only represents a fraction of our direct mission giving, God is glorified in how we serve our neighbors through the sharing of our space and our people.

### Growing: Fellowship & Discipleship

Shaping and nurturing our faith is a lifelong commitment.
